Population Aged 15 years and Over by Labour Force Activity: PHD, 2006

Highlights for the Peel-Halton-Dufferin Area

- In 2006, PHD had a higher labour force participation rate than Ontario and Canada (71.8% vs. 67.1%, 66.8%).
- In 2006, PHD had a higher employment rate than Ontario and Canada (67.5% vs. 62.8%, 62.4%).
- In 2006, PHD had a lower unemployment rate than Ontario and Canada (5.9% vs. 6.4%, 6.6%).

Implications for Human Services Sector

 Increased demand for jobs and employment counselling.

Did you know?

How large is the labour force in PHD?

In 2006, the labour force in PHD consisted of 932,090 persons over age 15, an increase of 15.7% over 805,570 persons in the labour force in 2001. Much of the increase in the labour force was due to the increase in women in the labour force.

What is the labour force participation rate for PHD?

The labour force participation rate for PHD in 2006 was 71.8% compared to 73.2% in 2001. PHD has a higher percentage of its age 15+ population in the labour force, compared to Ontario, and Canada. Within the PHD area, Dufferin has the highest labour force participation rate.

How many people in PHD were employed at the time of the 2006 Census of Canada?

In 2006, there were 877,025 people employed in PHD, an increase of 14.3% over the 767,070 employed people in 2001.

What is PHD's unemployment rate?


PHD's unemployment rate in 2006 for people aged 15 and over was 5.9%. PHD has a lower unemployment rate than Ontario and Canada. Within the PHD area, the highest unemployment rate was in Peel (6.4%), while the lowest was in Dufferin (4.5%).
