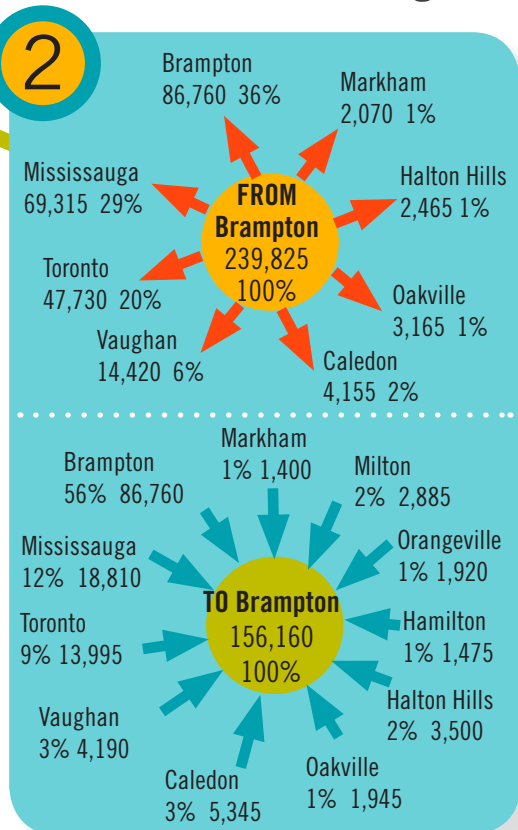

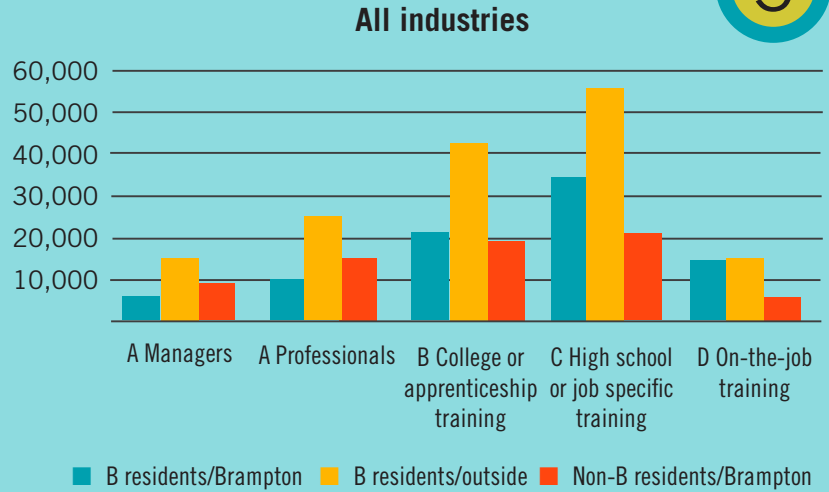

4 Statistics Canada uses the following schema



- Skill Level A**
 - Managers (usually requires a university degree)
 - Professionals (usually requires a university degree)
- Skill Level B**
 - College or apprenticeship training (usually requires a college diploma or an apprenticeship certificate)
- Skill Level C**
 - High school or job-specific training (usually requires a high school diploma)
- Skill Level D**
 - On-the-job training (usually requires no educational certificate)

The Brampton data has been analyzed by three commuting groups:

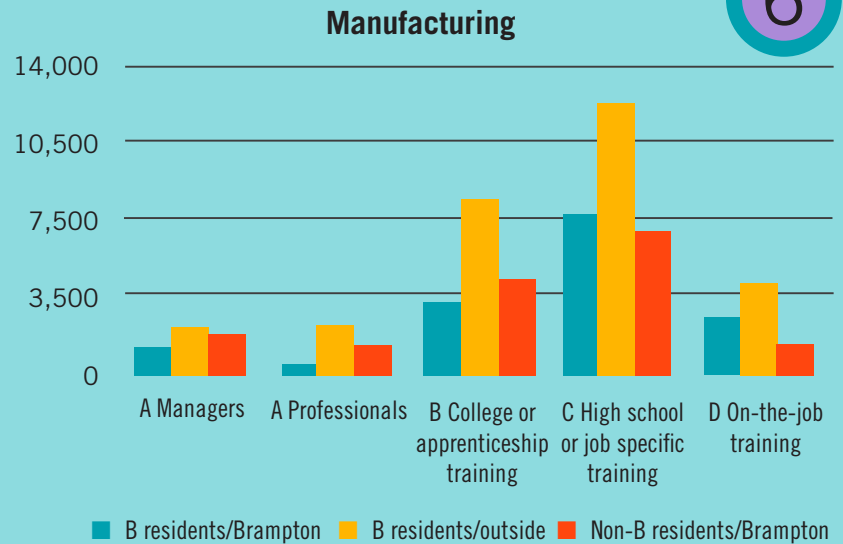
B residents/Brampton: Brampton residents commuting to jobs in Brampton:

Non-B residents/Brampton: Residents living outside Brampton commuting to jobs in Brampton

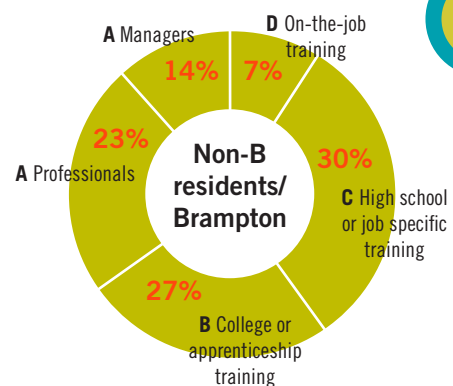
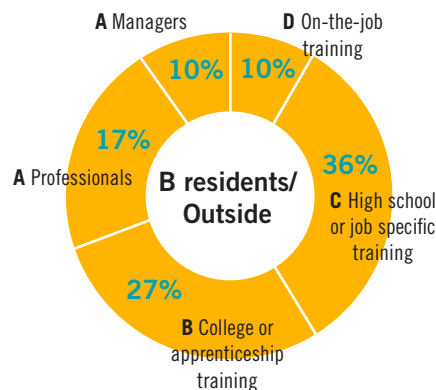
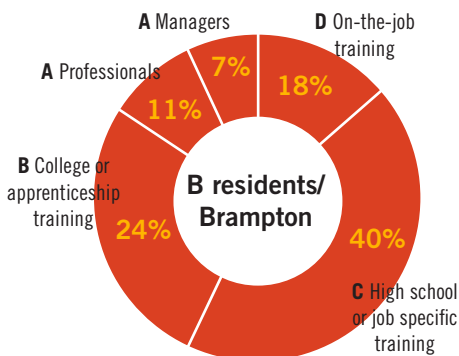

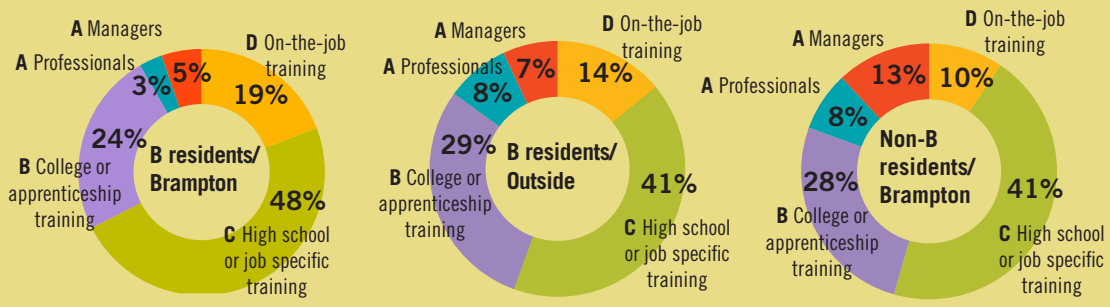
Distribution of skills by Brampton commuting populations

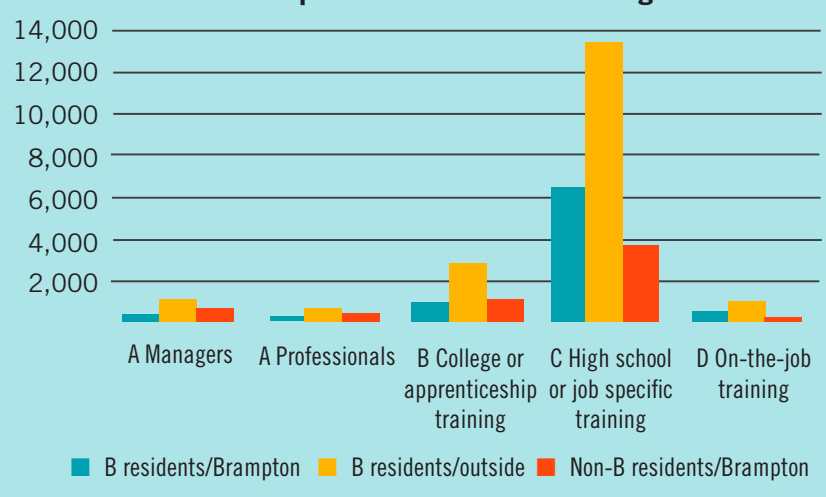

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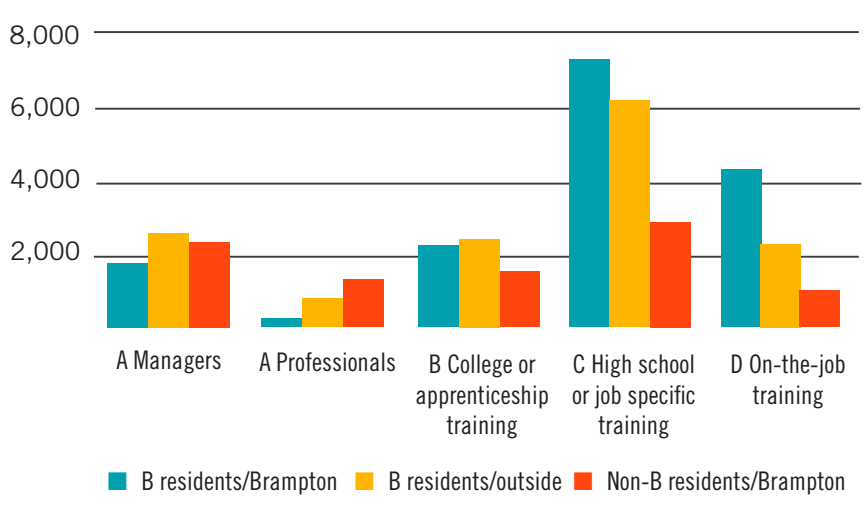

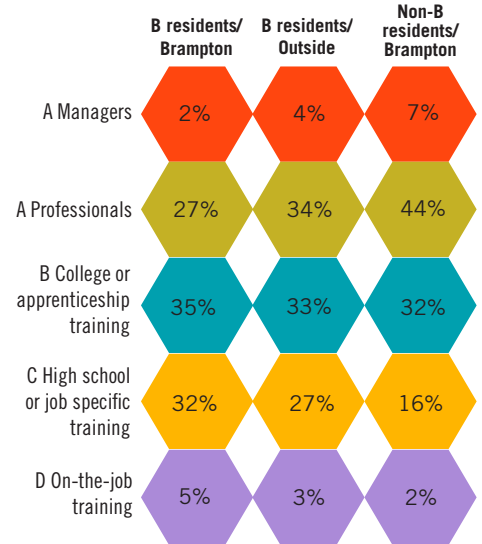
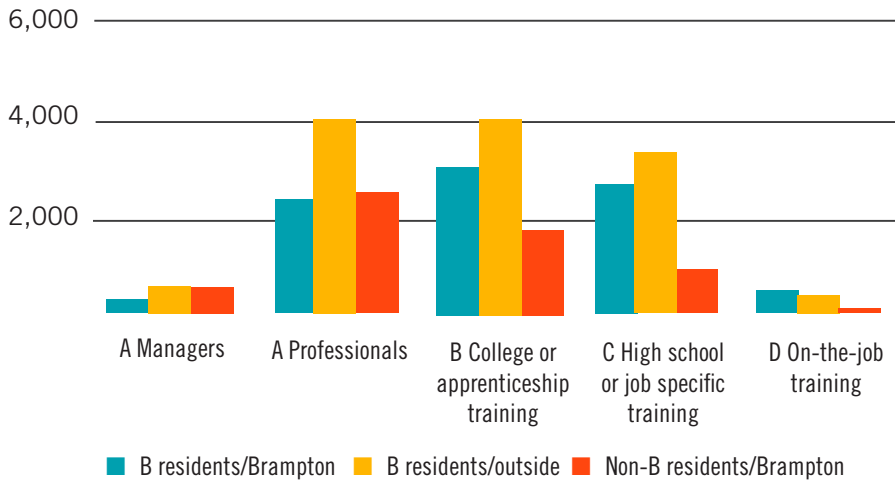
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Distribution of skills by Brampton commuting populations, Health care and social assistance, 2016

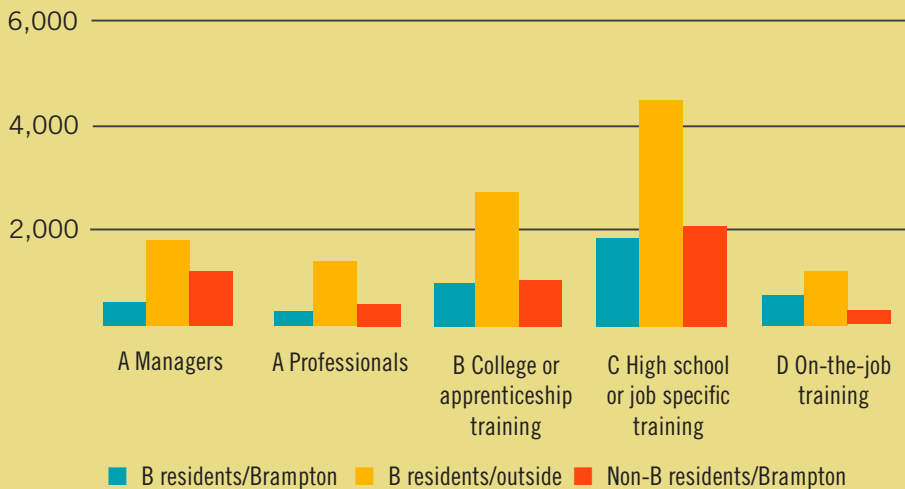

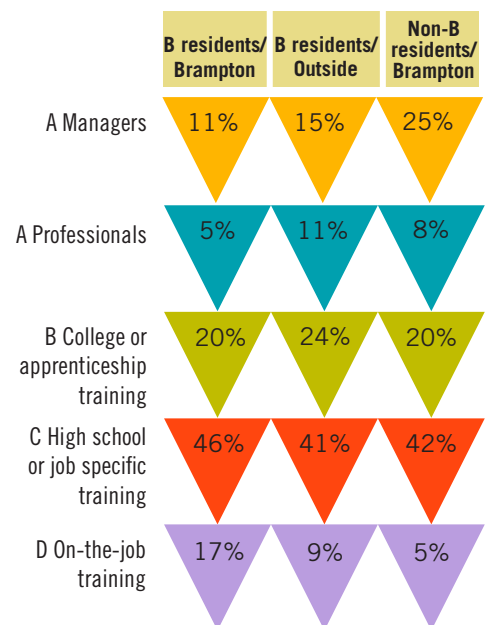
