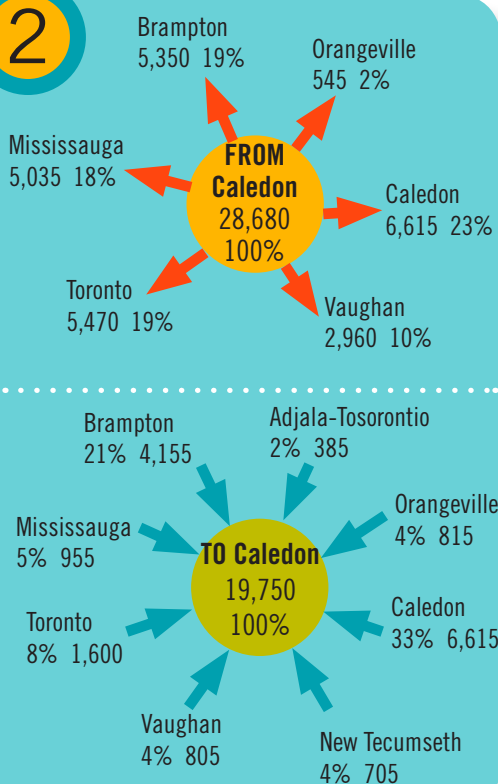

4 Statistics Canada uses the following schema

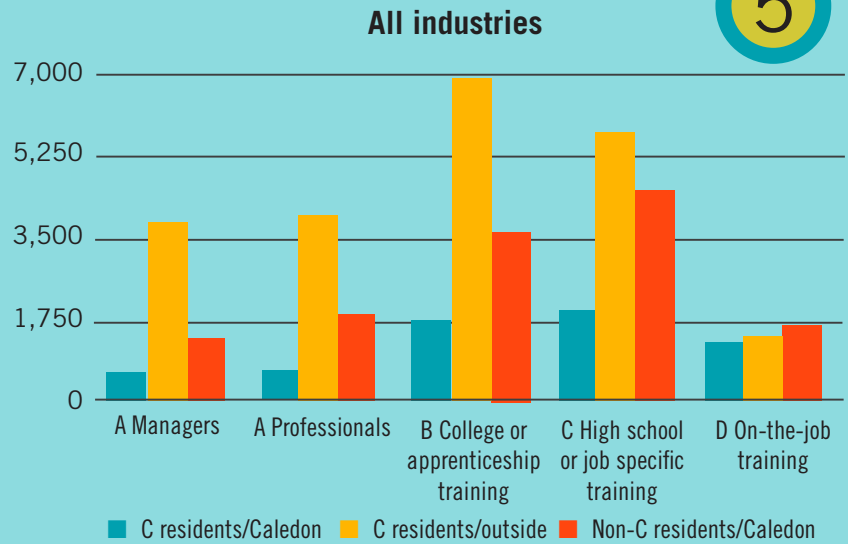


- Skill Level A** (usually requires a university degree)
 - Managers (usually requires a university degree)
 - Professionals (usually requires a university degree)
- Skill Level B** (usually requires a college diploma or an apprenticeship certificate)
 - College or apprenticeship training (usually requires a college diploma or an apprenticeship certificate)
- Skill Level C** (usually requires a high school diploma)
 - High school or job-specific training (usually requires a high school diploma)
- Skill Level D** (usually requires no educational certificate)
 - On-the-job training (usually requires no educational certificate)

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Commuting patterns related to Caledon by skill category, All industries, 2016

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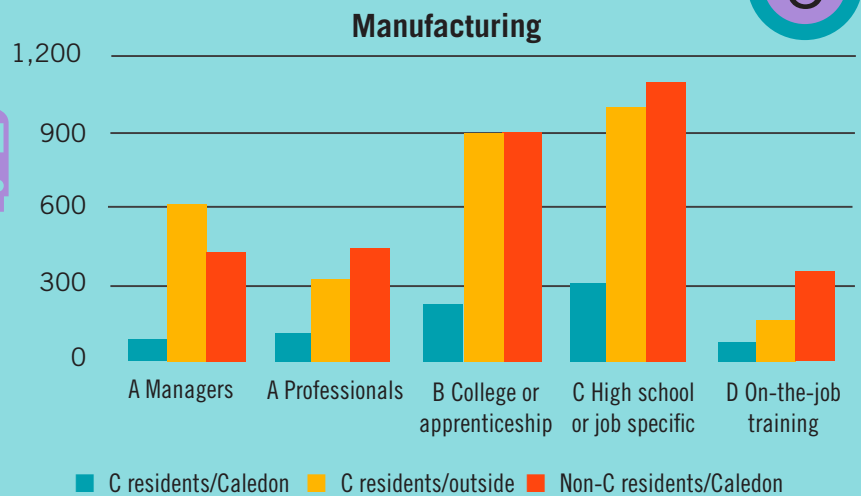
The Caledon data has been analyzed by three commuting groups:

- Non-C residents/Caledon:** Residents living outside Caledon commuting to jobs in Caledon



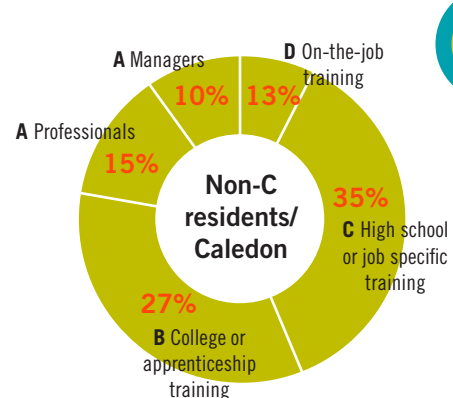
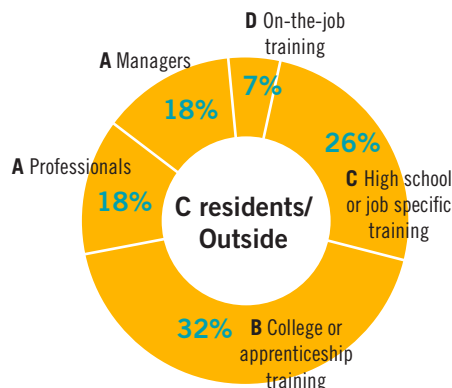
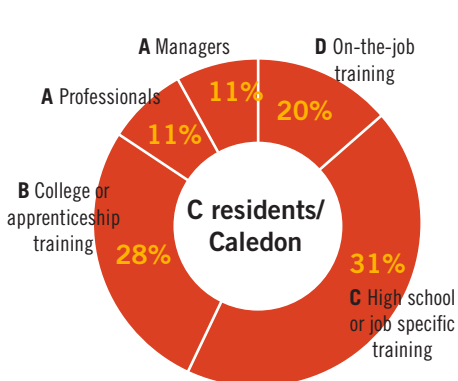
Commuting Patterns related to Caledon by skill category, Manufacturing, 2016

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Distribution of skills by Caledon commuting populations

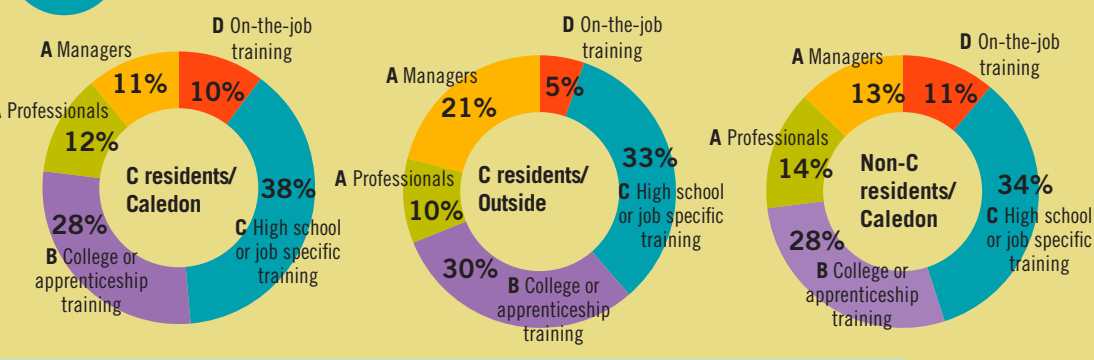

8 Distribution of skills by Caledon commuting populations Manufacturing, 2016

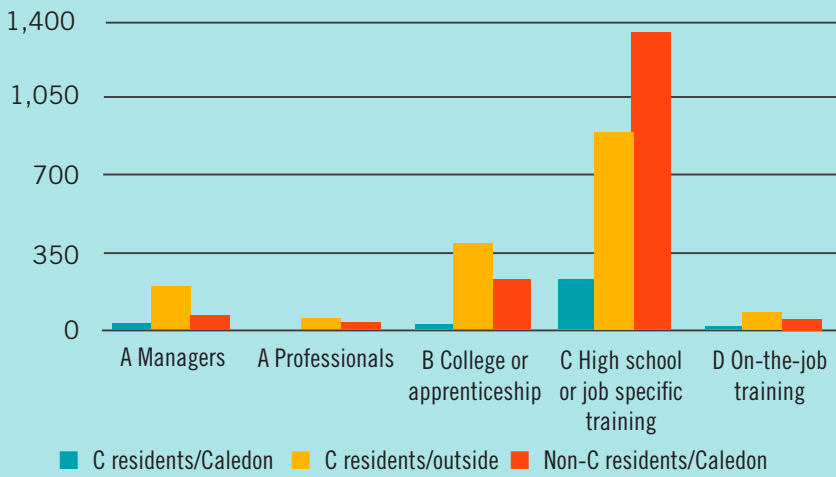


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9 Commuting Patterns related to Caledon by skill category, Transportation and warehousing, 2016

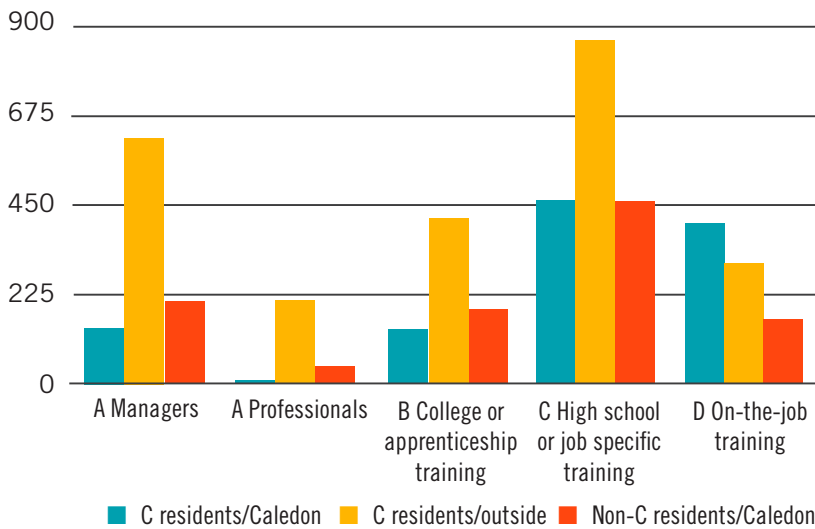

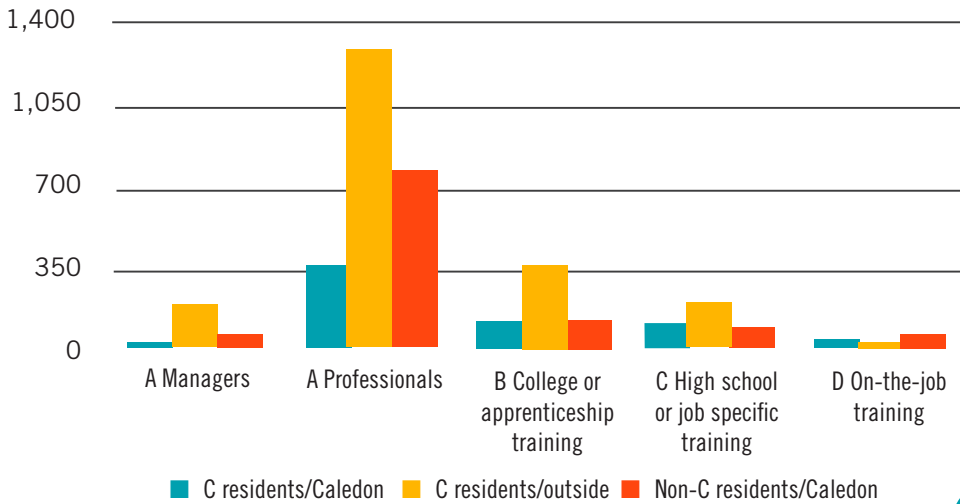

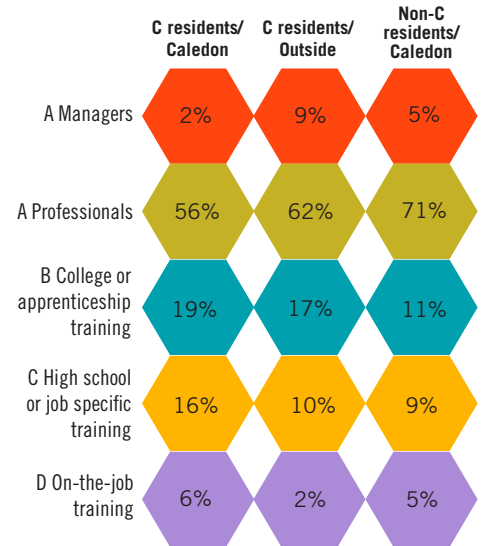
13 Commuting Patterns related to Caledon by skill category, Educational services, 2016

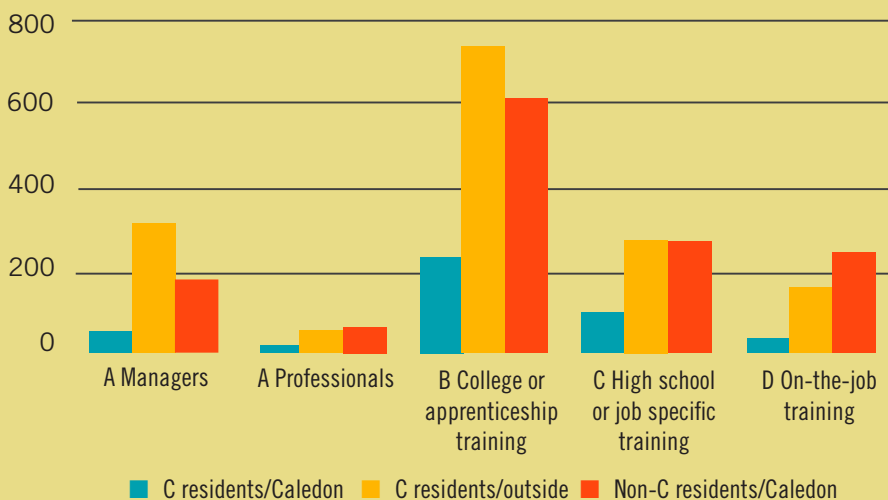
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14 Distribution of skills by Caledon commuting populations, Educational services, 2016

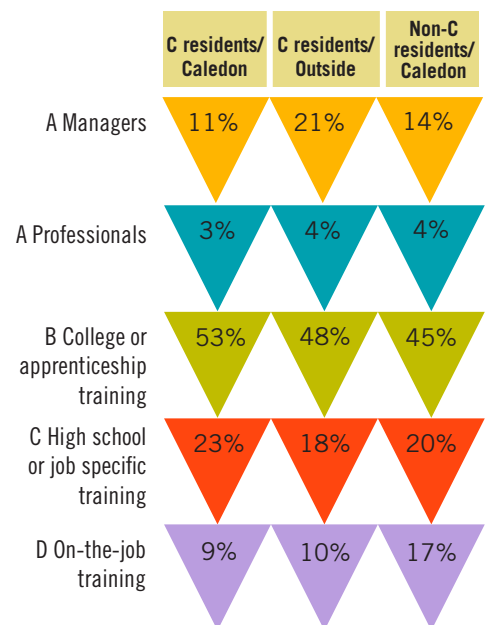
