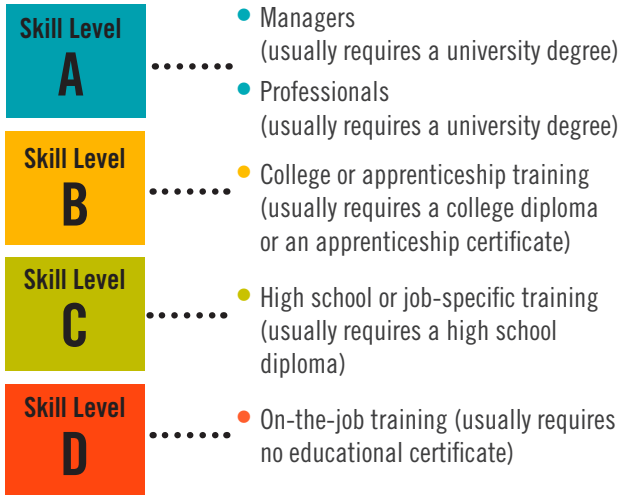

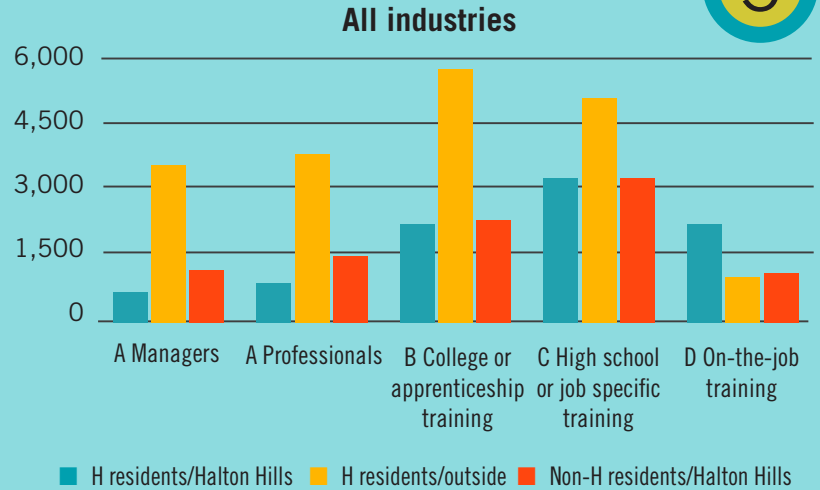

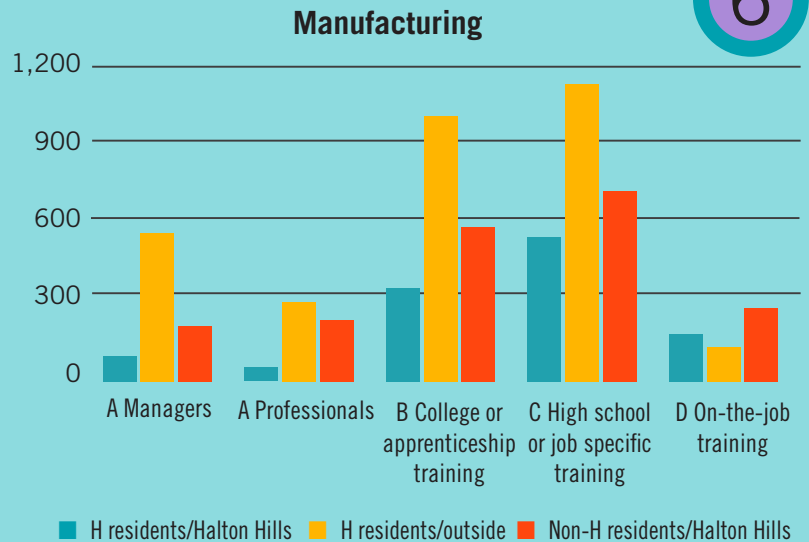
The Halton Hills data has been analyzed by three commuting groups:

- Non-H residents/Halton Hills:** Residents living outside Halton Hills commuting to jobs in Halton Hills.



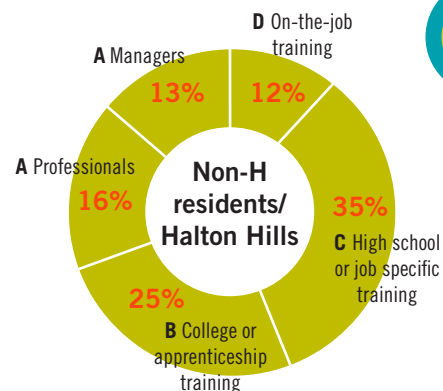
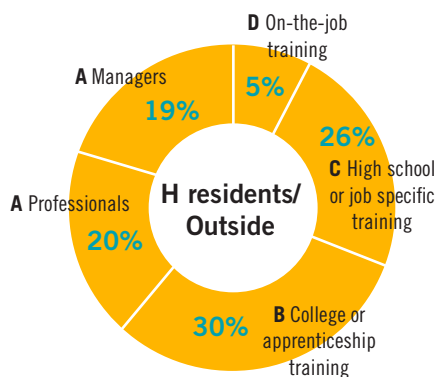
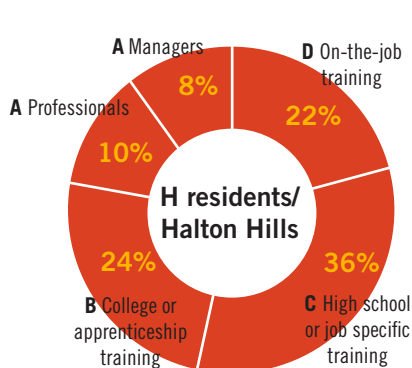
### Commuting patterns related to Halton Hills by skill category, Manufacturing, 2016

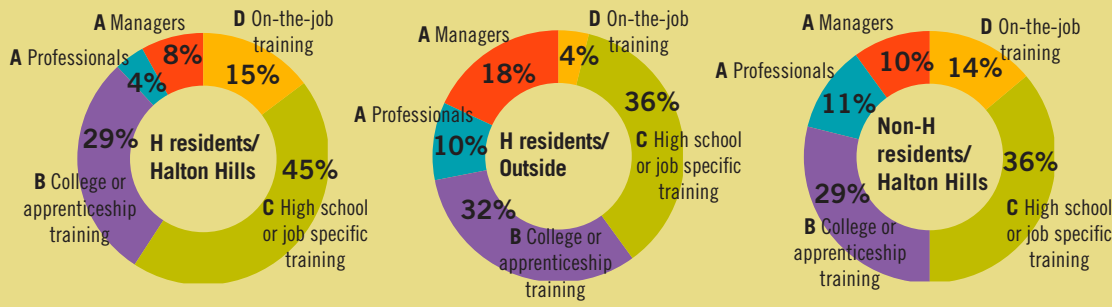

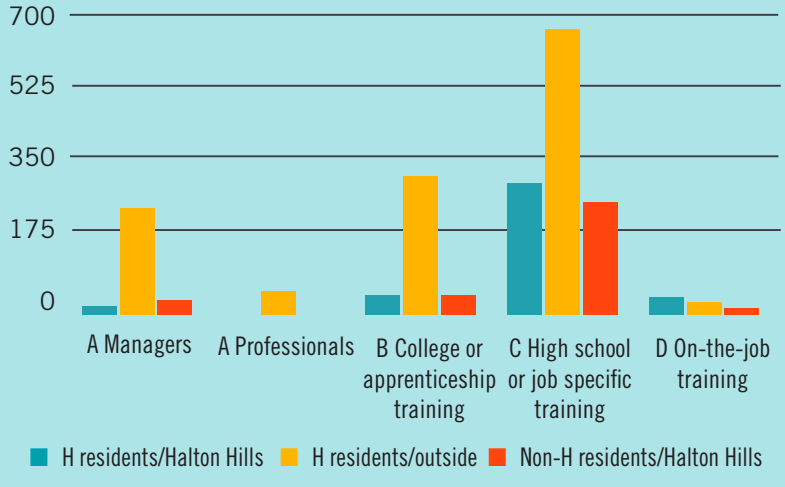

## Distribution of skills by Halton Hills commuting populations Transportation and warehousing, 2016

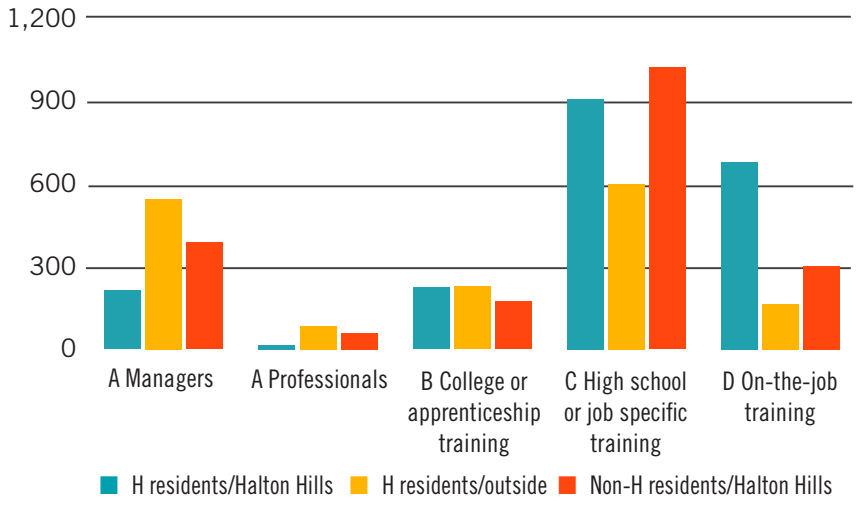

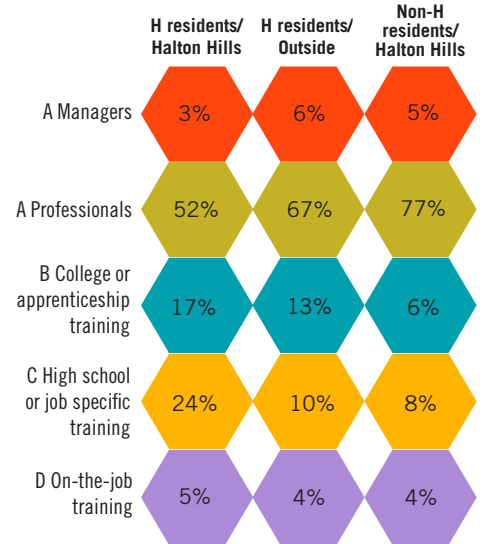
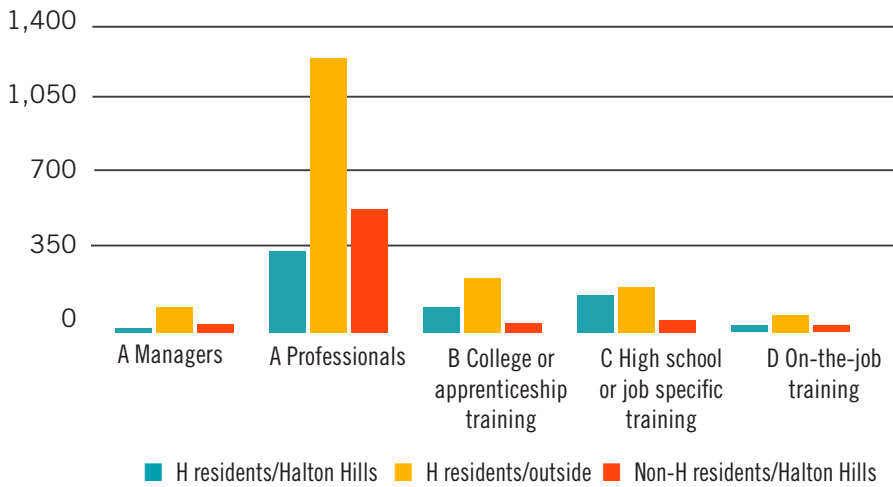

Distribution of skills by Halton Hills commuting populations, Educational services, 2016

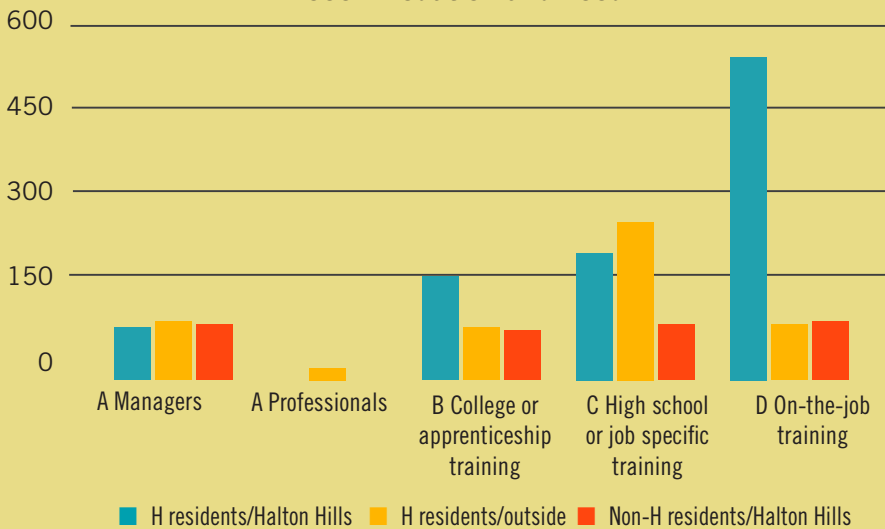

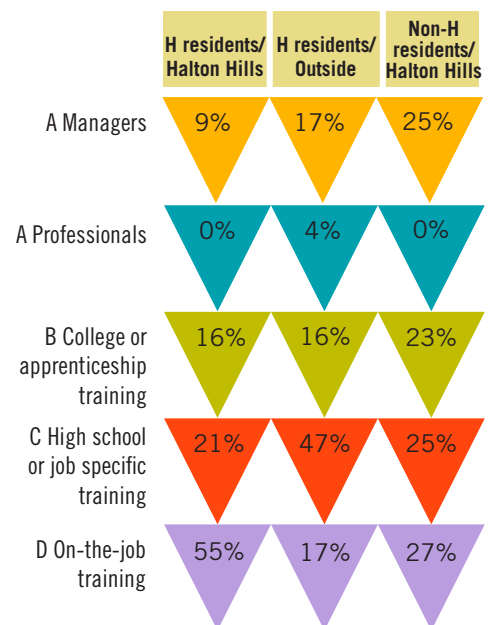
15 Commuting Patterns related to Halton Hills by skill category, Accommodation and food, 2016
